PUBLIC NOTICE N. 004/2021-PPGA/ICEAC/FURG FOR FOREIGN STUDENTS

The Management Graduate Program at FURG (PPGA/FURG) announces the Admission public notice for foreign students informing the criteria for the selection process of candidates for the Master's in Administration – 2021/2.

1. COURSE INFORMATION: MASTER SCIENCES IN ADMINISTRATION

1.1 FIELD OF KNOWLEDGE: Organizational Management

- 1.1.1 Research Lines:
- (1) Organizations, Market and Work
- (2) Managerial Technologies

1.2 GENERAL INFORMATION

The course of Master's in Administration is a program length of 2 academic years, offered in Portuguese. The subjects and academic activities may be offered in the morning, afternoon and evening shifts, from Monday to Friday, in online environment. The classes start on August 16th, 2021.

1.3 TARGET AUDIENCE:

Foreign candidates graduated on any Higher Undergraduate and/or Postgraduate Course.

1.4 LANGUAGE

- 1.4.1 The language of the course is Portuguese, being the Program abled to offer academic disciplines and activities in other languages.
- 1.4.2 The candidate will not be required to master the Portuguese or English language when entering the Program.
- 1.4.3 Successful candidates must prove at least an upper-intermediate level of Portuguese through a Certificate of Proficiency in Portuguese Language for Foreigners (CELPE-BRAS) or certification equivalent, at the university's discretion, as a prerequisite for dissertation presentation.
- 1.4.4 Once enrolled at the Institution, the approved candidate must follow the course requirements related to English language proficiency.

1.5 APPLICATION AND TUITION FEES

The Masters in Administration course is free as well its application in this public notice.

2. MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE SELECTION PROCESS

Applicants must be non-Brazilian citizens, holding a higher education diploma who have a passport or identity document valid in their country of origin.

3. VACANCIES

The University offers two (02) vacancies, one for each research line.

- a) "Organizations, Market and Work" 01 vacancy.
- b) "Managerial Technologies" 01 vacancy.

- (1) Organizations, Market and Work: consists of studies on "investigating organizations, marketing opportunities and people management from different epistemological, theoretical and methodological perspectives, dealing with themes such as organizational studies, social management, work relationships, people management, organizational learning, managerial competencies, entrepreneurship, tourism management, marketing, strategy, and finance".
- (2) Managerial Technologies: consists of studies on "innovation management, knowledge management, operational research, management control, management information systems, logistics, operations, and innovation in the supply chain".

3.2. ALLOCATION OF VACANCIES

The vacancies will be distributed among the course's professors, according to their area of expertise, alignment of project proposals and availability for supervision. If any of the vacancies reserved for each research line is not filled, this can be redistributed to the other one, if there is availability of a professor for supervision.

4. APPLICATION

4.1 ENROLLMENT

The enrollment will be held from July 1st to July 18th. Applicants should e-mail to the Coordination of the Graduate Program in Administration (ppga.coordenacao@furg.br) and submit all the necessary application documents strictly as required.

4.2. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS FOR APPLICATION:

The documents required for registration (except the electronic form to be filled out) must be scanned (using a scanner or other means) and attached to the e-mail sent to the Coordination of the Graduate Program in Administration (ppga.coordenacao@furg.br). Scanned documents do not need authentication.

Attention: All files must not exceed 30MB. If the uploaded files are too large, try converting to cheaper formats such as .jpg and .pdf. This will make the process easier.

4.3. DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED FOR APPLICANTS:

- a) online application form, duly completed;
- b) copy of identity document (nationality document, passport or national identity document);
- c) "Documented" Curriculum Vitae (CV), containing the workload and period of each activity (eg. teaching, professional card, etc.). Thus, in addition to the CV file, the candidate must assemble and provide a single file with the digital copies that prove the CV activities, in order of their citation in the CV. The documents in relation to the CV are: copies of the professional portfolio, contracts or certificates that allow proof of teaching and non-teaching professional experience, internships, monitoring, tutoring, scholarships and participation in research projects; copy of the 1st. page of articles, abstracts or other documents published or produced;
- d) copy of the Higher Education Diploma (undergraduate) or certificate of completion of higher education, signed by the competent body;
- e) copy of the Academic Transcripts of the graduation (bachelor's degree) and of Postgraduate, when applicable (disciplines taken and grades);
- f) research project in pdf format, between 8 and 15 pages, 1.5 spacing (one comma five), font Times New Roman no 12, containing: Cover (the cover must contain: title, author and, optionally, the research line*), Introduction, Delimitation of the research problem, Objectives, Justification, Theoretical framework, Methodology, References, presented according to current ABNT or APA standards. The project can be written in Portuguese, English or Spanish.
- g) Candidate's Letter of Intent with justification and declaration of availability to carry out the activities proposed by the Course.
- * If the research line is not informed, the Selection Committee is responsible for framing the project according to its analysis. This classification will not be subject to further appeal.

Attention: The application form must be filled in by the candidate, with the files containing the requested documents attached, and e-mailed to the Coordination of the Graduate Program in Administration. The Coordination will reply the email sent; if this does not occur, the candidate is advised to forward another e-mail and the documentation to the Coordination.

4.4 ADMISSION HOMOLOGATION

Applicants will be informed about their application until July 18th. The results for the aforementioned admission process will be published on the PPGA website www.ppga.furg.br.

5. SELECTION PROCESS AND SELECTION CRITERIA:

5.1 STAGE 1 - SCHOOL PERFORMANCE (classifying)

The final score of the school performance will be converted into a grade from zero to ten. In the case of the use of concepts, they will be transformed into grades according to the convention used by the Graduate Program in Administration

5.2 STAGE 2 - CURRICULUM ANALYSIS (classifying):

The score of the Curriculum Vitae will be converted into a grade from zero to ten. For the purposes of this conversion, a score of ten will be assigned to the candidate with the highest total score in the Curriculum Vitae among all candidates, by research line. For all other candidates, the simple rule of three for the attribution of the Curriculum Vitae applies.

5.3 STAGE 3 - RESEARCH PROJECT ANALYSIS (classifying)

^{*} The research project will be evaluated by at least two (02) professors of the research line to which the candidate wishes to apply. Candidates are encouraged to contact their prospective supervisors prior to application or check their research topics (available on http://ppga.furg.br/index.php/ppga/professores.html).

5.4 STAGE 4 - INTERVIEW (classifying)

<u>Interview Evaluation Criteria:</u>

Coherence of answers to the questions	2.0 points

^{*} The interview will be carried out by, at least, two PPGA professors, through web conference, whose virtual room will be informed to the candidates later.

5.4.1 Interview date

On July 20th, time and location of the interview will be announced on the PPGA website (www.ppga.furg.br) and by e-mail. Interviews will be held from 27 to 29 July 2021.

^{*} Papers accepted, but not yet published, will be counted – according to their QUALIS – since a document confirming the approval is presented in the documents.

^{**} Omitted cases will be decided by the Selection Committee.

6. SCORES AND RANKING

6.1 CRITERIA FOR CLASSIFICATION: Final scores and ranking by research line will be determined by the weights obtained in academic performance, curriculum vitae, research project, and interview as shown in the table below:

Academic performance	3.0
Curriculum Vitae	2.0
Research project	2.0
Interview	3.0

6.2 FINAL SCORE: The final score (FS) of the candidate will be calculated based on the following equation:

$$FS = \begin{bmatrix} (academic\ performance*3.0) + (curriculumvitae*2.0) + (research project*2.0) + (interview*3.0) \\ 10 \end{bmatrix}$$

- 6.2.1 The minimum Final Score (NG) for classification will be six (6.0) points.
- 6.2.2 In case of a tie, the candidate with the best performance in the analysis of the "Curriculum Vitae" will be chosen. Maintaining the tie, the older candidate will be chosen.
- 6.3 ANNOUNCEMENT OF RESULTS: The list containing the selected candidates will be published until August 2th on the PPGA's website (www.ppga.furg.br).

7. REGISTRATION

Admitted applicants should confirm their enrollment by e-mail addressed to the Coordination of the Graduate Program in Administration (ppga.coordenacao@furg.br) until August 10th. The documents required for enrollment will be informed by e-mail after the disclosure of the final list.

8. SCHOLARSHIPS

The Program has a limited number of scholarships provided by official funding agencies. Scholarships will be awarded in a process independent of the selection process, in accordance with rules to be defined by a commission specially constituted for this purpose, respecting the rules of the development agencies, according to the availability of scholarships in the Program for the year. Given the limited number of scholarships, the Graduate Program in Administration cannot guarantee the award of a scholarship.
